- Provision of local and Ministry of Health privacy-related information including:

 - Privacy Management Plan
 - Mandatory HETI training
 - Privacy policies and related procedures
 - Embedding privacy links in internal and external webpages

In 2016/17 NSW Health Pathology:

- Reviewed and maintained staff intranet resources that remind of privacy obligations and link to relevant legislation, policies, training and Privacy Contact Officer details.
- Published privacy news articles and reminders for staff that linked to staff intranet privacy resources.
- Was acknowledged by a private sector technology risk consultant for publishing a bestpractice example of ICT-related privacy advice for the public health sector. The article was based on NSW Ministry of Health privacy policies and guidelines.
